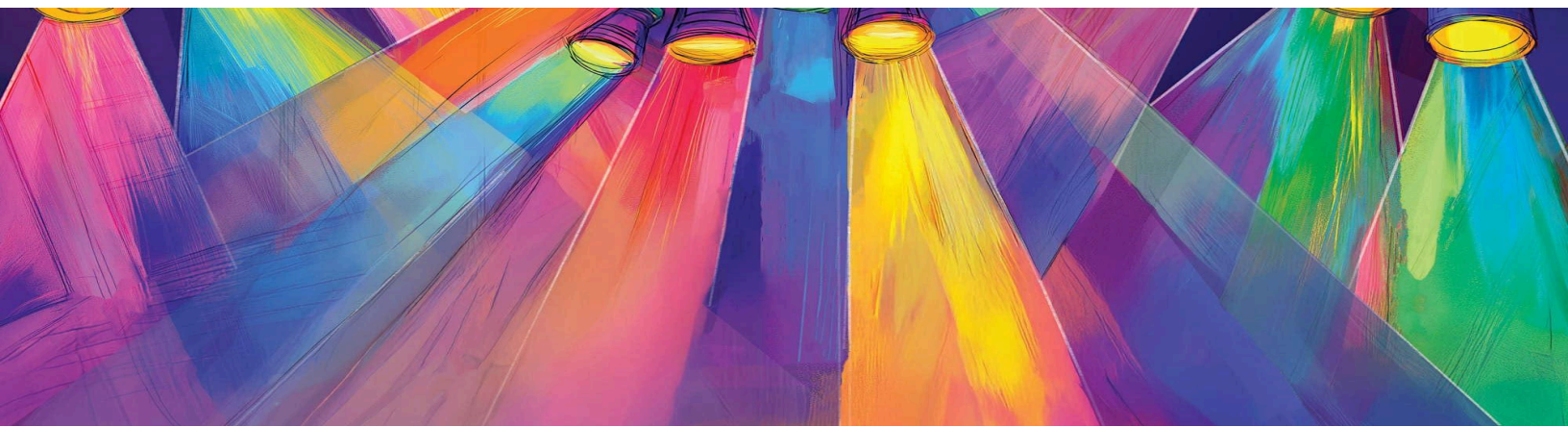

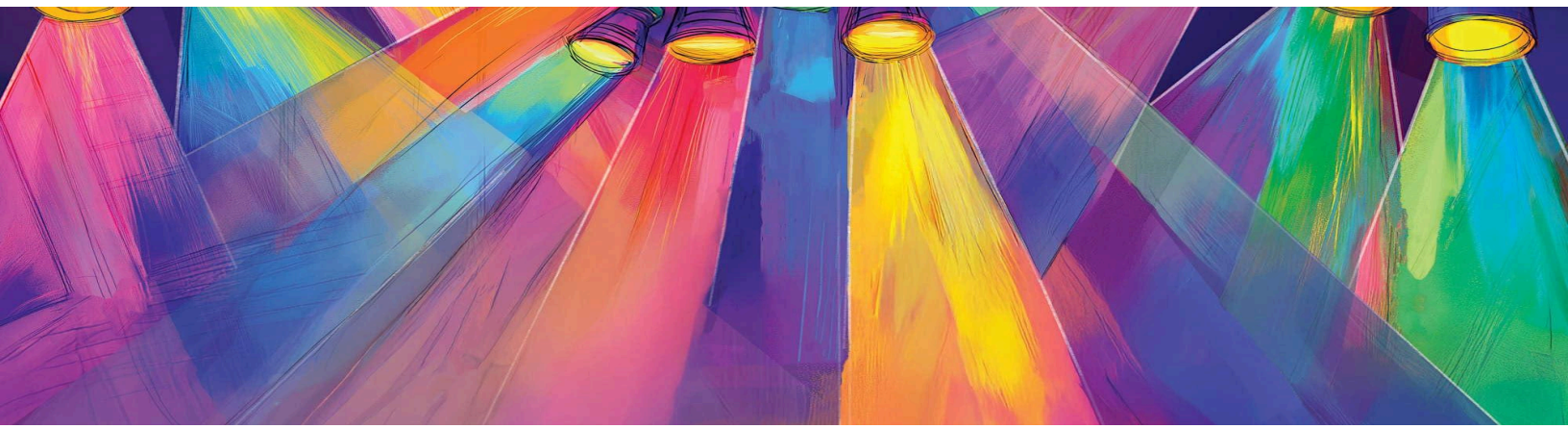

Meet us at Illumination Station for the brightest week of the year. Focus on Jesus at Spotlight Bible Study and bask in the colorful glow of sunlight streaming in at Suncatcher Recreation. Twirl in the glittering refracted light of Mirror Ball Music and pass through strands of twinkling lights on the way to Kaleidoscope Crafts. Turn it all the way up for Neon Snacks and bring it all the way down for Glow-in-the-dark Missions. Kids will explore all the ways light brightens, illuminates, reflects, and reveals while discovering that Jesus is the light who brings hope to a dark world! Like the disciples, kids will be challenged to answer Jesus' question, "Who do you say that I am?" They will discover it's not a matter of opinion. Jesus is who Scripture says He is—the perfect, proven, and powerful Son of God.

LEVELS OF BIBLICAL LEARNING

Jesus is the Messiah and Savior.

CHRIST CONNECTION

Our sin keeps us from fully knowing the truth about who Jesus really is. Jesus came as the light to shine in a world darkened by sin. Jesus' birth, life, death, and resurrection show us who He really is—the perfect and powerful Son of God who came to be our Savior.

VBS SCRIPTURE

Jesus spoke to them again: "I am the light of the world. Anyone who follows me will never walk in the darkness but will have the light of life." *John 8:12*

Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life. *John 8:12 (KJV)*

DAY 1: JESUS IS GOD'S PROMISED SON

Jesus Asked Who People Thought He Was
(Matthew 16:13-20)

Jesus asked His disciples who people said that He is and who the disciples said that He is. Simon Peter said Jesus was the Messiah. Jesus said Peter was blessed because God had revealed the truth to him. Jesus said Peter would share the good news about Jesus and start His church.

DAY 2: JESUS IS GOD'S PERFECT SON

The Baptism of Jesus (Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:1-11; John 1:29-34)

God sent John the Baptist to get people ready for Jesus. Jesus told John that He wanted to be baptized because God said it was right so John baptized Jesus. God's voice came from heaven. "This is My Son," the voice said. "I love Him, and I am very pleased with Him!"

DAY 3: JESUS IS THE POWERFUL SON OF GOD

Jesus Performed Miracles (Matthew 15:29-39)

Large crowds came and Jesus healed sick people in the crowd. Jesus wanted to provide food. The disciples had 7 loaves of bread and a few small fish. Jesus broke the food into pieces. There was enough for everyone to eat until they were full and there were 7 large baskets of leftovers! Jesus fed 4,000 men plus women and children that day.

DAY 4: JESUS IS THE PROVEN SON OF GOD

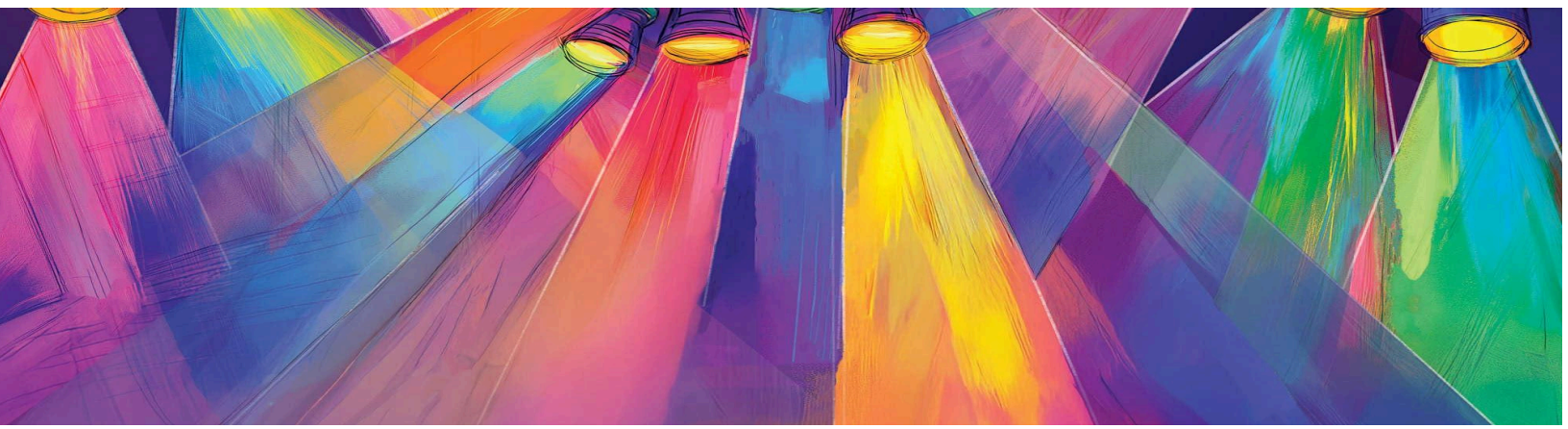
Jesus Died and Rose to Life (Mark 14:43–16:7)

Jesus was arrested, put on trial, and nailed to a cross. After Jesus died, He was buried in a tomb. Some women went to the tomb. When they got there, they saw that the stone had been rolled away. They went in but did not find Jesus' body. Instead, a man dressed in a white robe told them Jesus is alive!

DAY 5: JESUS IS GOD'S PLAN FOR FORGIVENESS

Peter Preached About Jesus (Acts 2)

Peter told a crowd that God had proven who Jesus was by doing miracles, wonders, and signs through Him. The people were very sorry for their sins. Peter told them to repent—turn from disobeying God to obeying God—and be baptized in the name of Jesus for the forgiveness of their sins. That day about 3,000 people responded to Peter's message, repented, and were baptized.



10 THINGS VBS VOLUNTEERS SHOULD KNOW

1. Arrive Early and Come Prepared

VBS begins at 6:30 PM, but volunteers should arrive no later than **6:00 PM** each evening. Arriving early allows time for prayer, final preparation, volunteer communication, and welcoming children as they arrive. A calm, prepared volunteer creates a better experience for everyone.

2. Safety Is Everyone's Responsibility

Nothing is more important than the safety and well-being of the children entrusted to our care. This means you need to follow all safety policies.

3. Learn Names Quickly

One of the most powerful things you can do is learn and use a child's name.

4. Your Attitude Sets the Tone

Children often mirror the attitude of the adults around them. Smile often. Be enthusiastic. Stay positive. Celebrate participation. Encourage children frequently. Even when you're tired, remember that your energy helps create an environment where children want to learn and engage.

5. Every Child Matters

Remember that every child is created in the image of God and deeply loved by Him.

6. Follow the Schedule

A well-organized VBS creates a better experience for children, volunteers, and families.

7. Look for Gospel Opportunities

Every volunteer is a minister. Many of the most meaningful ministry moments happen outside the classroom.

8. Parents Are Part of Our Ministry

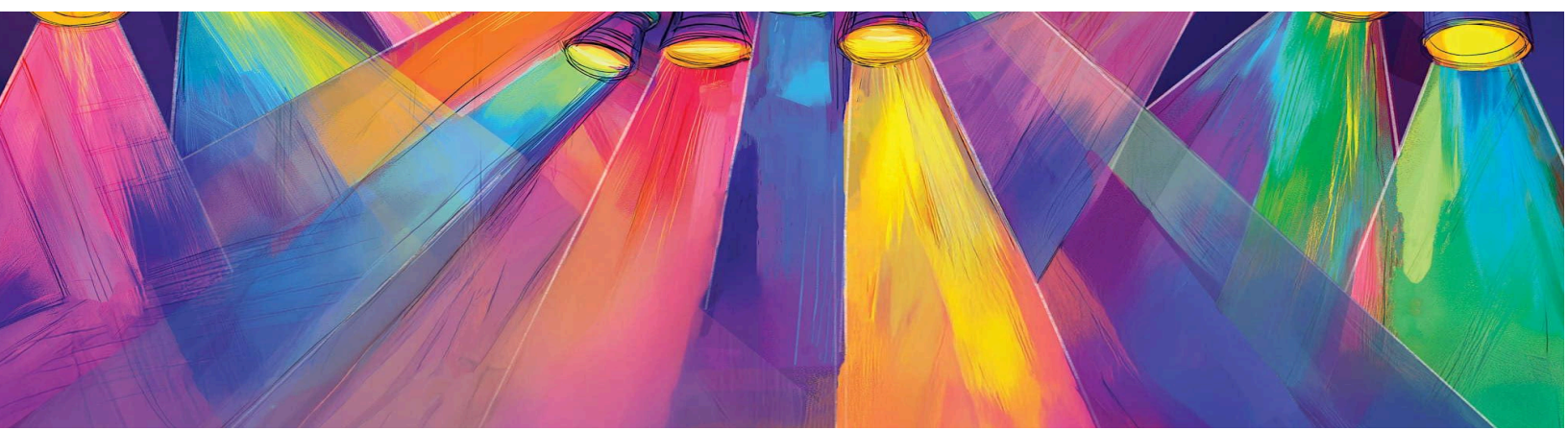
Every interaction with a parent matters. We want families to leave saying, "Those people genuinely cared about my child."

9. Protect the Unity of the Team

Ministry works best when volunteers work together. As Psalm 133:1 reminds us: "How delightfully good when brothers live together in harmony!"

10. Pray Constantly

Most importantly: Pray! Prayer is not something we do before ministry. Prayer is the ministry. Ultimately, no amount of planning, preparation, or programming can accomplish what only God can do.



VOLUNTEER EXPECTATIONS

Serving with Excellence

Serving at Vacation Bible School is both a privilege and a responsibility. Children and families trust us with what matters most to them. As representatives of Jesus Christ and Gospel Baptist Church, we want to serve with integrity, excellence, and genuine love.

The following expectations are designed to help us create a safe, organized, and Christ-honoring environment throughout VBS week.

Be Present

VBS works best when every volunteer is faithfully serving in their assigned role. If an emergency prevents you from attending, notify your ministry leader as soon as possible so arrangements can be made.

Cell phones should be used only when necessary for ministry purposes.

Your faithfulness matters.

Arrive Early

All volunteers should arrive no later than 6:00 PM each evening. ***Whenever possible, arriving by 5:45 PM is encouraged.***

Dress Appropriately

Volunteers should dress modestly, comfortably, and appropriately for ministry activities. Official Volunteer shirts are recommended.

Protect Every Child

For the safety and privacy of families:

- Do not post photos of children without church approval.
- Do not share personal information about children or families.
- Do not communicate privately with minors through social media platforms.
- Direct any questions regarding media usage to VBS leadership.

Show Christ-Like Love

Every interaction should reflect kindness, patience, and respect. Build children up rather than tear them down. Children should never be embarrassed, ridiculed, threatened, or shamed.

Correction may be necessary at times, but it should always be done with grace and dignity.

Appropriate Physical Contact

Appropriate physical interaction may include: Handshakes, High-fives, Fist bumps, Brief side hugs, and a reassuring pat on the shoulder

Volunteers should avoid: Tickling, Wrestling, Extended embraces, Lap sitting (except where necessary in approved preschool settings, and any physical interaction that could be misunderstood. When in doubt, choose caution and maintain appropriate boundaries.

Disciplinary Issues

Never engage in angry confrontations with children. Never threaten children. Never use physical discipline. Leadership is available to help. For questions or concerns, please communicate through your ministry leadership team:

SHARING THE GOSPEL WITH KIDS

The word **gospel** means “good news.” It is the message about Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation. Use the following guide to share the gospel with kids.



GOD RULES. The Bible tells us God created everything, including you and me, and He is in charge of everything. (Genesis 1:1; Revelation 4:11; Colossians 1:16-17)



WE SINNED. Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God. (Romans 3:23) The Bible calls this sin. Because God is holy, God cannot be around sin. Sin separates us from God and deserves God's punishment of death. (Romans 6:23)



GOD PROVIDED. God sent His Son, Jesus, the perfect solution to our sin problem, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us. (John 3:16; Ephesians 2:8-9)



JESUS GIVES. Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever! (Romans 5:8; 2 Corinthians 5:21; 1 Peter 3:18)



WE RESPOND. We can respond to Jesus. The ABCs of Becoming a Christian is a simple tool that helps us remember how to respond when prompted by the Holy Spirit to receive the gift Jesus offers.

ADMIT to God that you are a sinner. The first people God created chose to sin and disobey God. Ever since then, all people have chosen to sin and disobey. (Romans 3:23) Tell God you messed up and you are sorry for doing your own thing, and turning away from Him through your thoughts, words, and actions. Repent, turn away from your sin. (Acts 3:19; 1 John 1:9) Repent doesn't just mean turning from doing bad things to doing good things. It means turning from sin and even from your own good works, and turning to Jesus, trusting only in Him to save you.

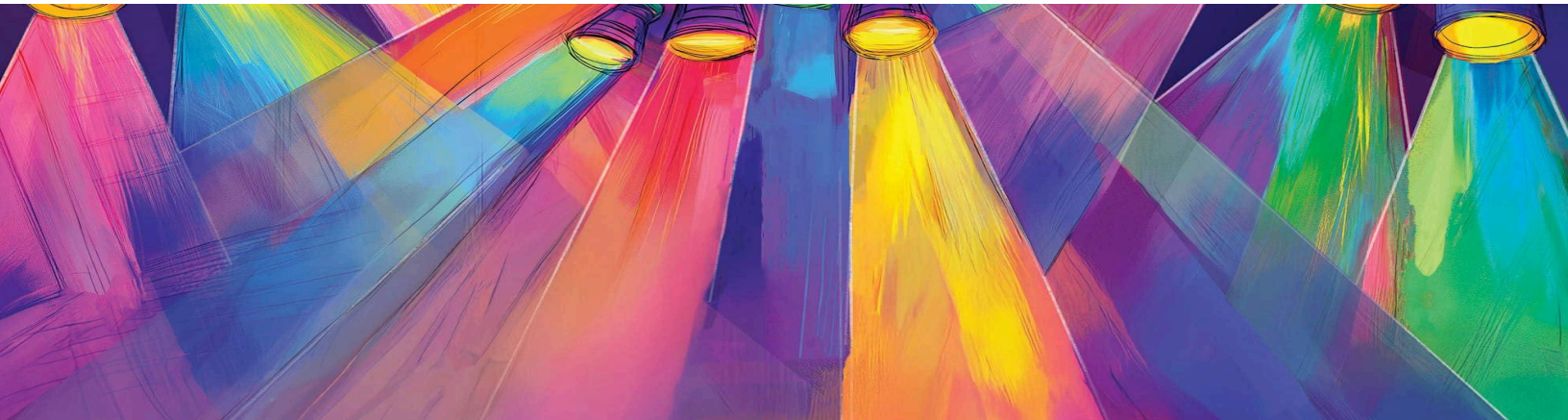
BELIEVE that Jesus is God's Son and receive God's gift of forgiveness from sin. You must believe that only Jesus can save you, and you cannot save yourself from your sin problem—not even by going to church or reading your Bible. Your faith or your trust is only in Jesus and what He did for you through His life, death, and resurrection. (Acts 16:31; Acts 4:12; John 14:6; Ephesians 2:8-9)

CONFESS your faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord. Tell God and tell others what you believe. If Jesus is your Savior, you are trusting only in Him to save you. Jesus is also Lord, which means He is in charge. You can start following Him and doing what He says in the Bible. You are born again into a new life and look forward to being with God forever. (Romans 10:9-10,13)



If you sense that children are under conviction from the Holy Spirit and would like to respond to the good news, spend some time counseling and praying with them individually. If you sense that a child is not ready to pray and respond in faith and repentance, continue to prayerfully teach him about Christ during the week.





CHILD PROTECTION & SAFETY POLICIES

Our Commitment

At Gospel Baptist Church, the safety and well-being of every child is a sacred responsibility.

Parents entrust us with their children each evening, and we are committed to providing a safe, secure, caring, and Christ-honoring environment where children can learn about Jesus and grow in their faith. Every volunteer shares responsibility for protecting children physically, emotionally, and spiritually.

These policies exist not only to protect children, but also to protect volunteers and the integrity of our ministry.

THE TWO-ADULT RULE

No volunteer should be alone with a child. This policy protects both children and volunteers. A child should always be accompanied by two approved adults.

CLASSROOM SUPERVISION

Volunteers should maintain active supervision at all times. If you must leave your area, notify another approved volunteer or ministry leader.

RESTROOM PROCEDURES

Preschool Children

Whenever possible: Volunteers should avoid isolated situations. Children should be given appropriate privacy. Assistance should only be provided when necessary.

Elementary Children

Most elementary-aged children should use the restroom independently.

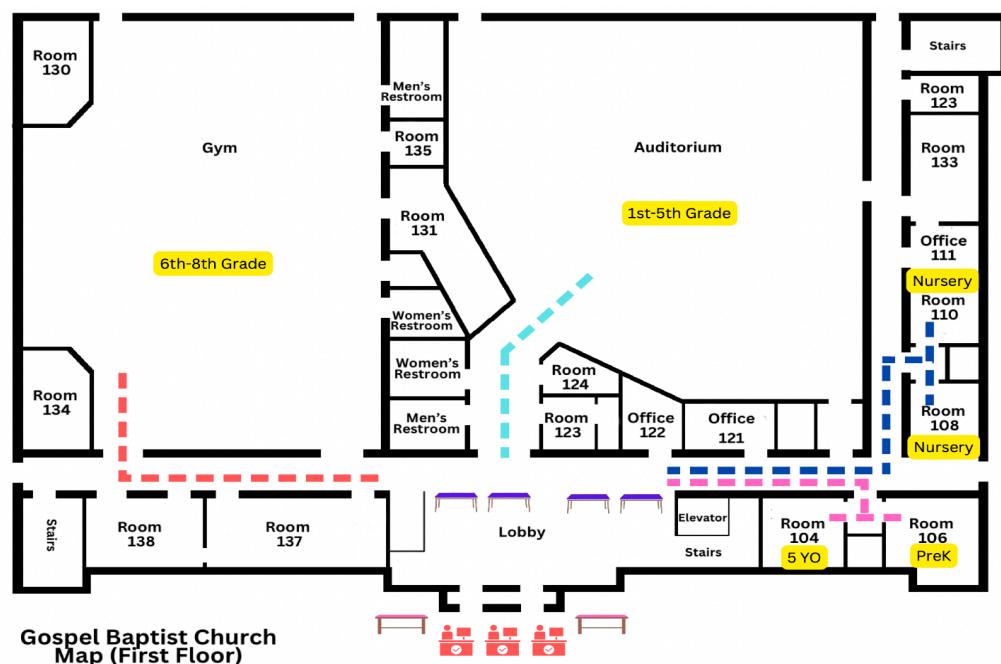
Volunteers should: Remain outside the restroom area when appropriate. Monitor hallways and entrances. Avoid entering restroom stalls except when absolutely necessary.

The goal is always safety, accountability, and appropriate supervision.

DROP OFF (CHECK-IN) PROCEDURES

1. Families will enter through the Main Entrance.
2. Stop at the Check-In Team under the portico/at the doors to receive your child's name tag and security sticker (*orange tables in diagram*).
 - If they have not registered, we will have registration stations outside.
3. Families will then enter the lobby and stop at the Admin (Points) Tables (*purple tables in diagram*)
4. After check-in, children will go to their assigned area:
 - Nursery → Rooms 108/110
 - Pre-K → Room 106
 - 5-Year-Olds → Room 104
 - 1st–5th Grade → Auditorium
 - 6th–8th Grade → Gym

Remind parents to keep your security sticker. They will need it for pick-up. See the diagram below for more information.



PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Security Requirement

Parents/guardians must show their security sticker at pick-up.

If a parent/guardian does not have the security sticker, they must show a photo ID/license before the child can be released.

Nursery, Pre-K, and 5-Year-Old Pick-Up

Parents will pick up children directly from their assigned rooms (Pick up between 8:15 pm - 8:30 pm)

- Nursery → Rooms 108/110
- Pre-K → Room 106
- 5-Year-Olds → Room 104

Please have your security sticker ready before arriving at the classroom door.

Elementary Pick-Up – 1st–5th Grade

Elementary children will be picked up in the Auditorium.

Parents should follow the marked traffic flow on the map:

1. Enter the Auditorium pick-up area.
2. Follow the blue arrows through the pick-up route.
3. Parents show their security sticker to the child's leader/guide before the leader/guide releases the child.
4. Pick up child from the 1st–5th Grade pick-up areas (center pews - grades will be marked by signage)
5. Exit through the marked Auditorium exit.

6. NOTE: Parents are welcome to sit in the "guest seating" areas shown in the image during the closing ceremonies.

This traffic flow helps us keep everyone moving safely and prevents congestion.

Middle School Pick-Up — 6th–8th Grade

Middle school students will be picked up in the Gym.

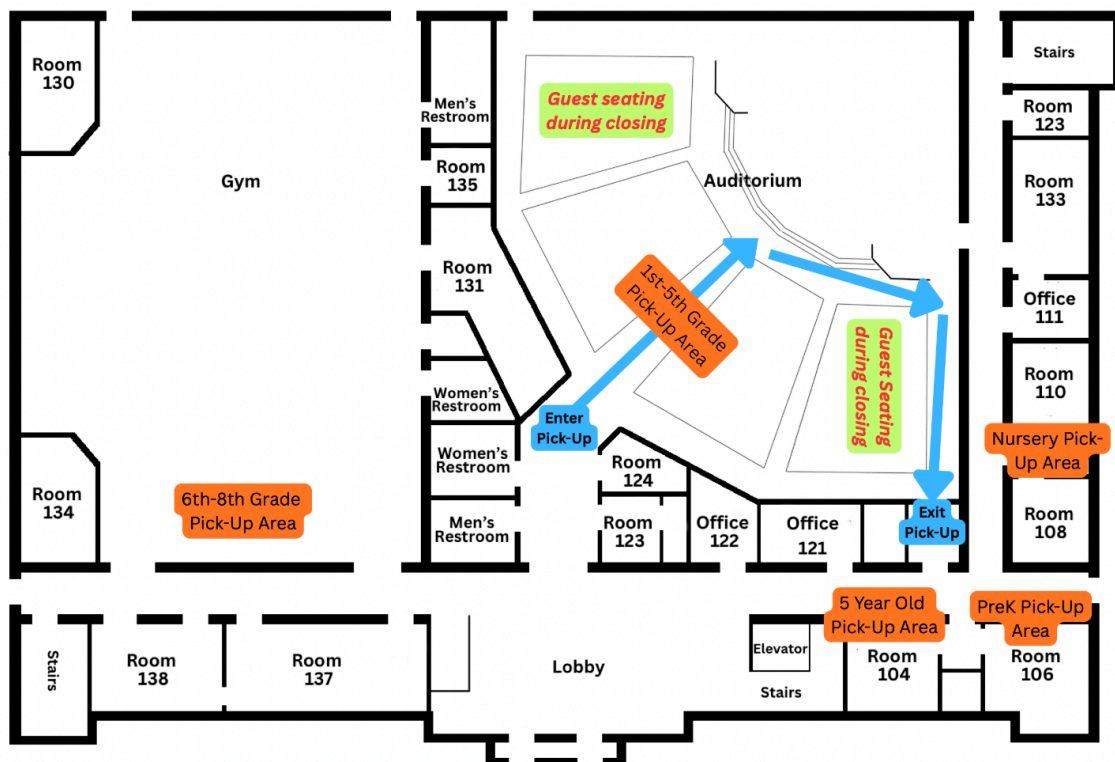
Parents may go directly to the Gym pick-up area and check out their student there.

Volunteer Reminder

Do not release a child without the matching security sticker.

If a parent does not have the sticker, kindly direct them to a VBS Director, Admin Team Lead, or Pastor so their ID can be verified.

Our goal is to keep every child safe while making pick-up clear, calm, and organized.



MEDICAL CONCERNS

If a child becomes injured or ill:

1. Stay calm.
2. Notify your ministry leader immediately.
3. Contact the designated first-response team.
4. Complete any required incident documentation.
5. Allow leadership to communicate with parents.

Do not administer medication unless specifically authorized by church policy and leadership. When in doubt, contact leadership.

MISSING CHILD PROCEDURE

If a child cannot be located:

1. Notify VBS leadership immediately.
2. Provide the child's name and last known location.
3. Continue supervising the remaining children.
4. Follow leadership instructions.

Do not initiate independent searches that leave other children unsupervised. Every missing child situation should be treated seriously and addressed immediately.

SEVERE WEATHER PROCEDURES

In the event of severe weather:

- Follow instructions from VBS leadership and create confidence with calmness.
- Move children calmly and quickly.
- Keep groups together and take attendance when possible.
- Remain with your assigned group until further instructions are given.

FIRE OR BUILDING EVACUATION

If evacuation becomes necessary:

- Follow designated evacuation routes.
- Keep children together and move quickly and calmly.
- Take attendance and report missing children immediately.

VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS

Every Role Matters

Whether you are teaching a lesson, greeting families at check-in, preparing snacks, running technology, or praying behind the scenes, your service contributes to the overall mission of helping children hear and respond to the gospel.

NURSERY TEAM

Purpose

Provide loving and dependable care for the children of volunteers and approved guests.

Responsibilities

- Care for infants and toddlers.
- Maintain safety procedures.
- Meet basic needs.
- Communicate with parents.
- Create a nurturing environment.

PRESCHOOL TEACHERS

Purpose

Preschool Teachers provide age-appropriate Bible teaching while creating a loving and engaging environment for young children.

Responsibilities

- Teach the daily Bible lesson.
- Lead discussion and activities.
- Reinforce the daily Bible truth.

- Encourage participation.
- Work closely with Preschool Assistants.
- Maintain a safe classroom environment.

PRESCHOOL ASSISTANTS (PRE-K)

Purpose

Preschool Assistants support teachers by helping children participate successfully in all classroom activities.

Responsibilities

- Assist with classroom management.
- Help children during activities.
- Support restroom procedures.
- Welcome and comfort nervous children.
- Assist with transitions.
- Support the teacher throughout the evening.

KINDERGARTEN TEACHERS

Purpose

Teachers bridge the gap between preschool and elementary ministry by providing Bible instruction.

Responsibilities

- Teach the daily Bible lesson.
- Lead discussions and activities.
- Encourage participation.
- Partner with Kindergarten Assistants.

KINDERGARTEN ASSISTANTS

Purpose

Assist Kindergarten Teachers in creating a safe, organized, and enjoyable learning environment.

Responsibilities

- Assist during lessons and activities.
- Help children stay engaged.
- Monitor safety and behavior.
- Support classroom transitions.

ELEMENTARY GUIDES

Purpose

Elementary Guides serve as the primary shepherds for their assigned group of children throughout the evening.

Responsibilities

- Welcome children and learn names quickly.
- Escort children between stations.
- Maintain attendance and accountability.
- Build relationships with children.
- Encourage participation.
- Assist station leaders as needed.
- Monitor behavior and safety.
- Watch for opportunities for gospel conversations.
- Elementary and Middle School groups rotate between ministry stations throughout the evening rather than remaining in a single classroom.

Middle School Guides

- Welcome children and learn names quickly.
- Escort children between stations.
- Maintain attendance and accountability.
- Build relationships with children.
- Encourage participation.
- Assist station leaders as needed.
- Monitor behavior and safety.
- Watch for opportunities for gospel conversations.
- Elementary and Middle School groups rotate between ministry stations throughout the evening rather than remaining in a single classroom.

RECREATION TEAM

Purpose

Use games and activities to reinforce relationships, build excitement, and create an enjoyable VBS experience.

Responsibilities

- Lead activities safely by explaining rules clearly.
- Encourage participation and foster teamwork and sportsmanship.

CHECK-IN/ADMINISTRATION TEAM

Purpose

Create a welcoming first impression while ensuring secure and accurate registration procedures.

Responsibilities

- Welcome families warmly.
- Assist with registration.
- Verify information.
- Manage security tags.
- Answer questions.
- Help guests navigate the building.

SAFETY TEAM

Purpose

Provide a safe and secure environment for children, volunteers, and guests.

Responsibilities

- Monitor entrances and exits.
- Assist with emergencies.
- Respond to security concerns.
- Support child protection policies.
- Coordinate with leadership when needed.

SNACK TEAM

Purpose

Serve refreshments efficiently.
while demonstrating hospitality and care.

Responsibilities

- Prepare and distribute snacks.

- Maintain cleanliness.
- Monitor allergy information.
- Follow food safety guidelines.

EMCEE TEAM

Purpose

Create energy, excitement, and continuity during assemblies and large-group gatherings.

Responsibilities

- Lead opening and closing sessions.
- Communicate announcements.
- Introduce activities and speakers.
- Maintain enthusiasm and engagement.
- Reinforce the theme and daily Bible truth.
- Assist children as needed.

TECH CREW

Purpose

Support VBS through sound, lighting, media, presentations, and technical operations.

Responsibilities

- Operate audio and visual equipment.
- Manage presentations and videos.
- Troubleshoot technical issues.
- Support assemblies and worship.

WORSHIP TEAM

Purpose

Lead children and volunteers in Christ-centered worship that reinforces the truths being taught throughout the week.

Responsibilities

- Lead worship songs enthusiastically.
- Encourage participation.
- Model worship engagement.
- Support theme integration.

MISSIONS TEAM

Purpose

Help children develop a heart for the Great Commission and God's work around the world.

Responsibilities

- Present nightly missions content.
- Connect mission lessons to the gospel.

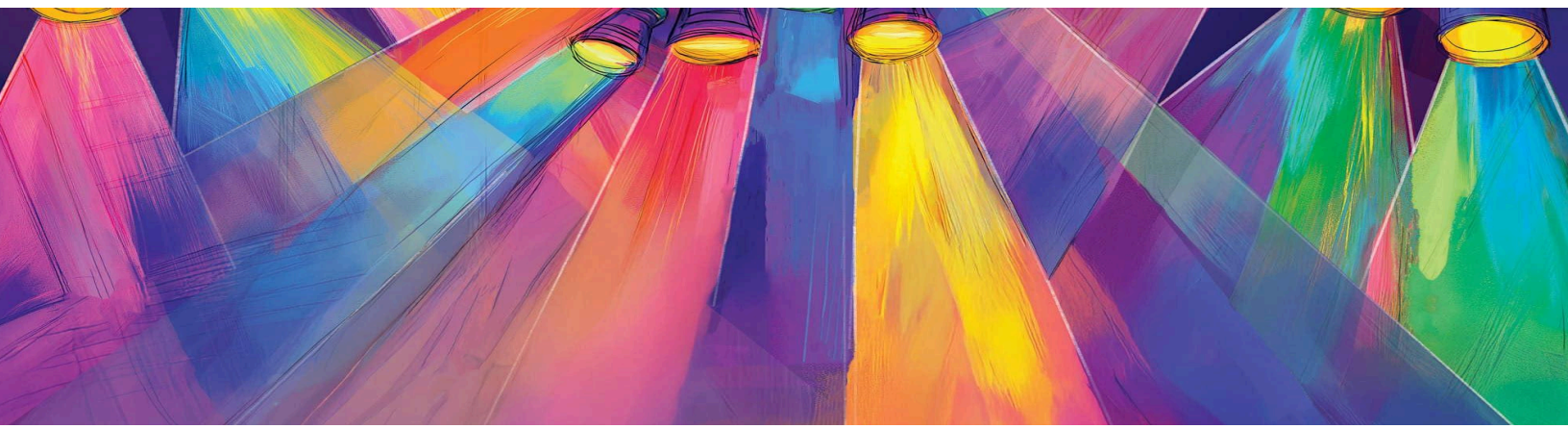
PHOTOGRAPHY TEAM

Purpose

Capture meaningful moments that celebrate God's work during VBS.

Responsibilities

- Take photographs throughout the week and provide for communications.
- Follow all photography guidelines.



COUNSELING CHILDREN

Counselors serve as a spiritual resource during Vacation Bible School by helping children understand the gospel, answer biblical questions, and provide guidance during significant spiritual conversations.

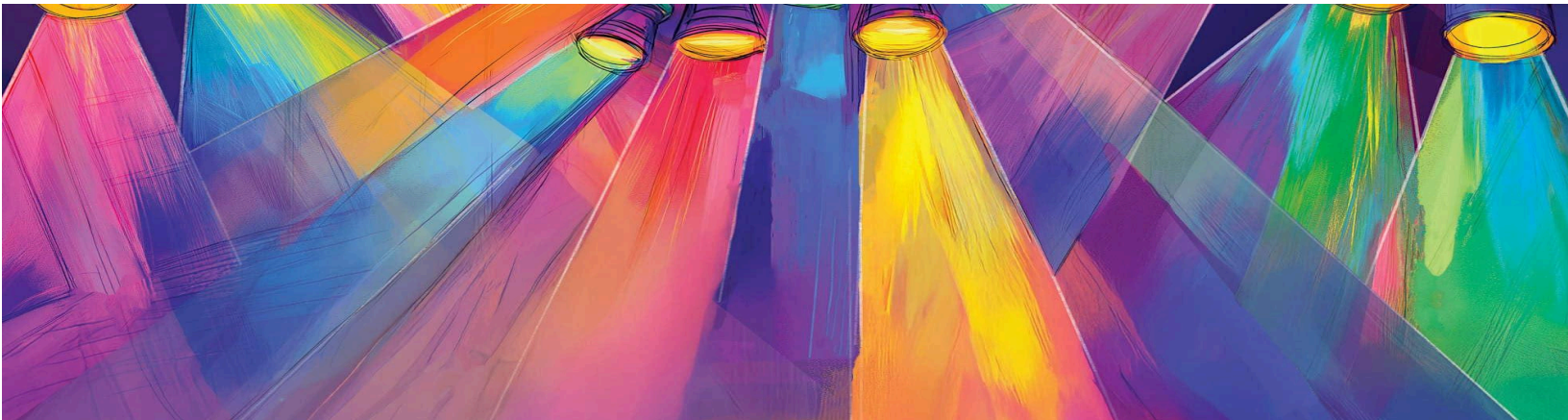
Counselors partner with VBS leadership, teachers, and parents to ensure children receive clear, biblically faithful guidance regarding salvation and other spiritual matters.

Responsibilities

- Be available throughout the evening for spiritual conversations.
- Assist children who express interest in salvation, baptism, or following Christ.
- Use the Lifeway Gospel Framework when discussing the gospel (see p. 9)
- Pray with children when appropriate.
- Communicate significant spiritual conversations to VBS leadership.
- Help ensure parents are informed of important spiritual decisions.

When a Child Has Questions

If a volunteer encounters a child asking significant spiritual questions, the volunteer should: Listen carefully, encourage the child's questions, and notify the appropriate Counselor, Pastor, or VBS Director.

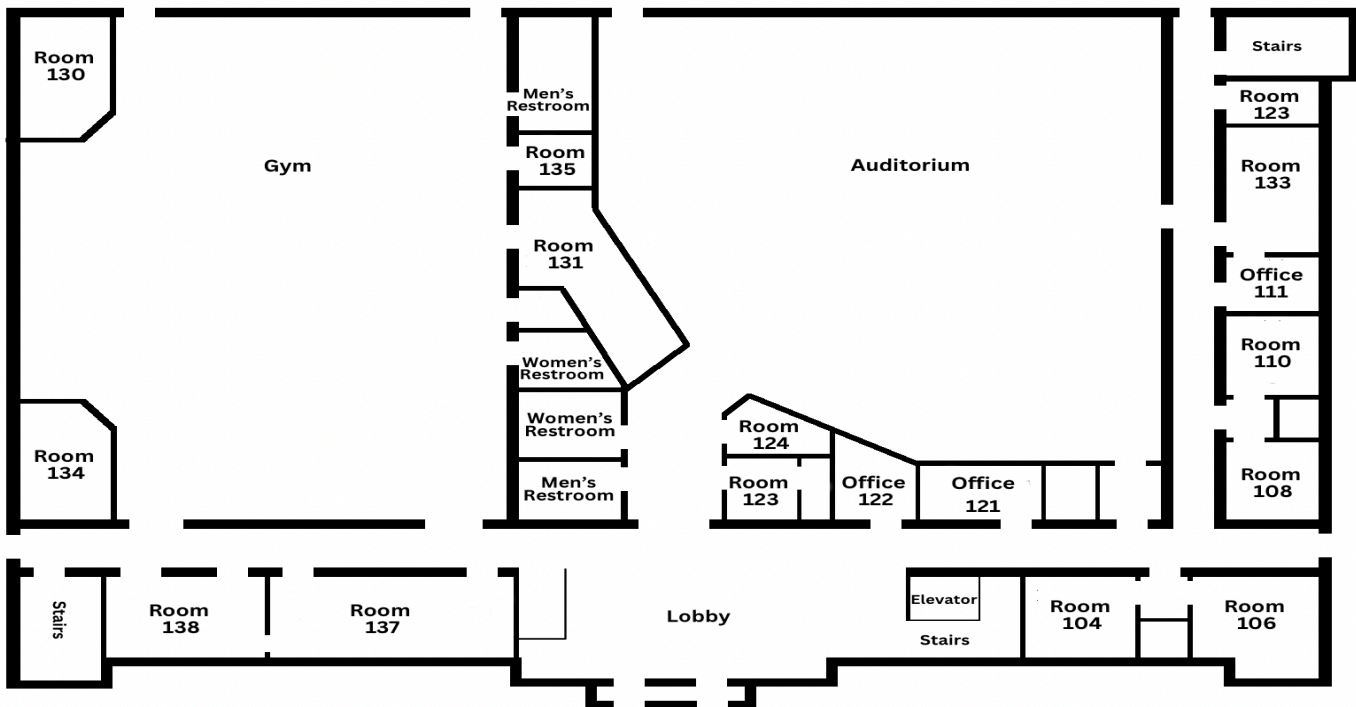

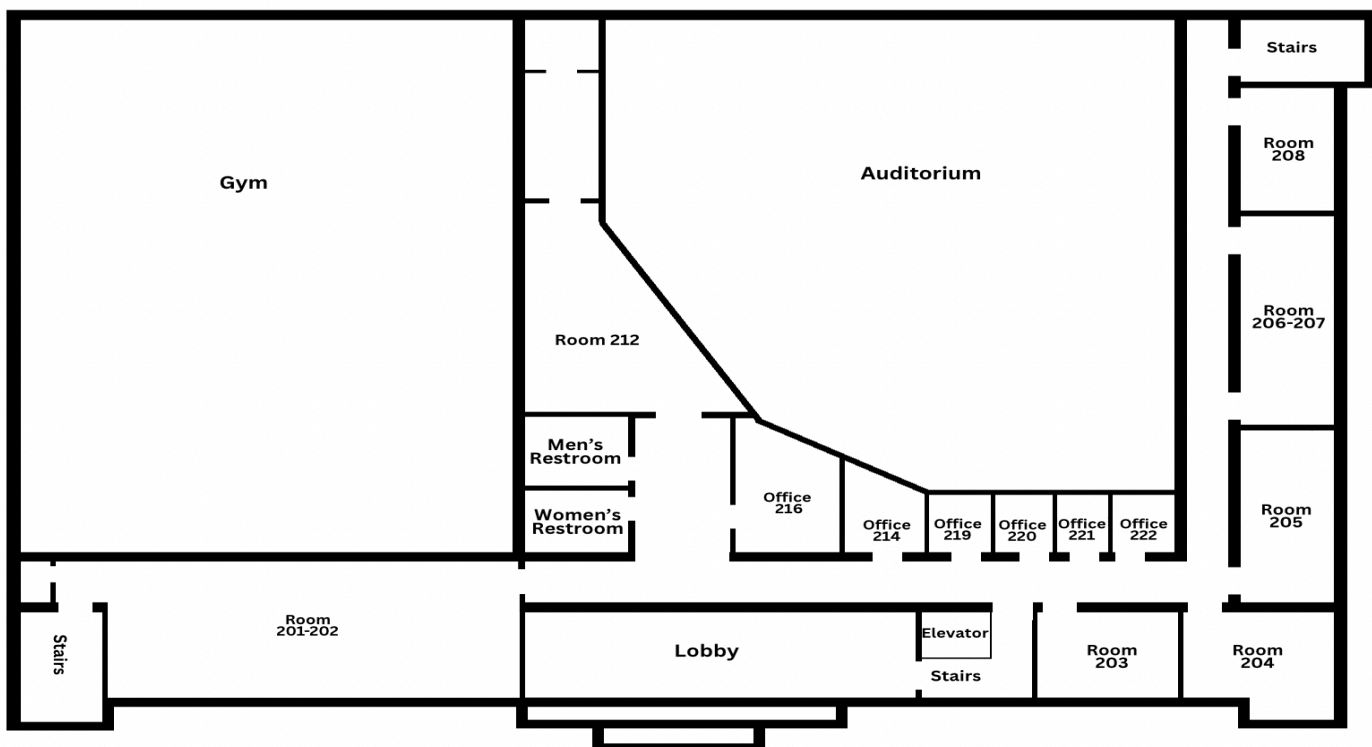

VBS INDOOR LOCATIONS

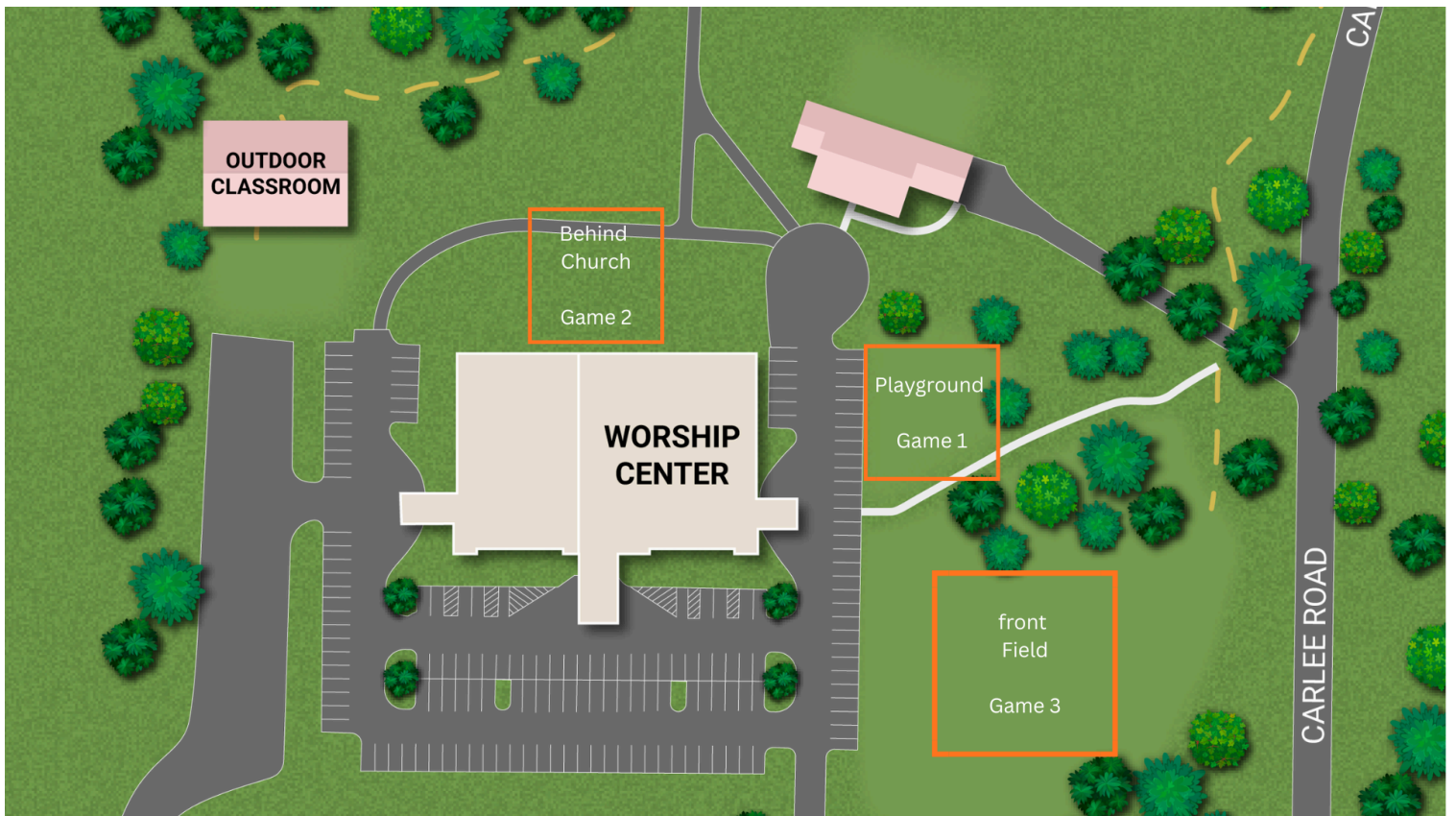
FIRST FLOOR

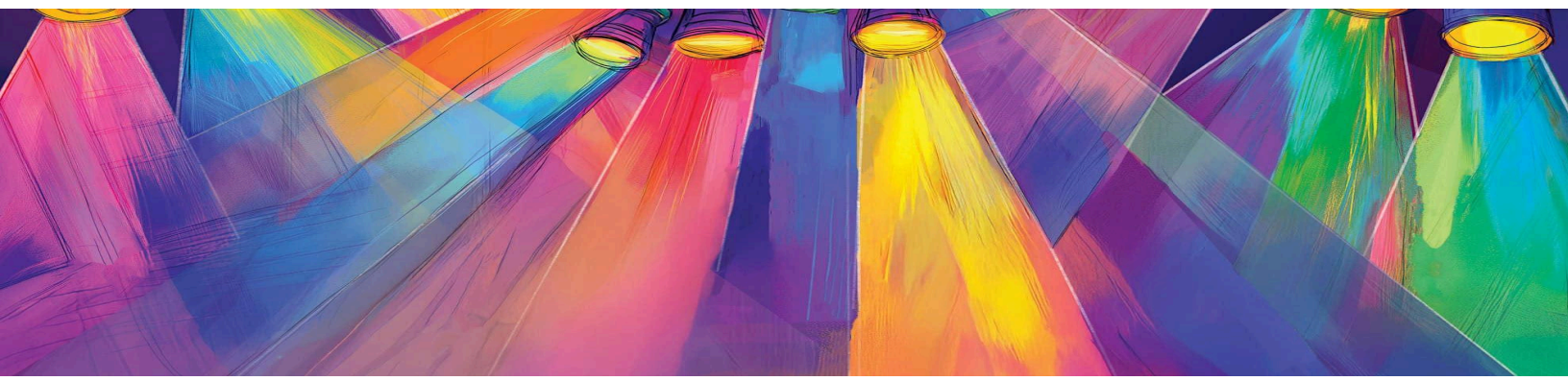


SECOND FLOOR
